Analysis of Teacher's Feedback (2022-2023) :

Mode of Feedback: Collection of feedback in prescribed format through WhatsApp group and print copy.

Stake Holders: Regular and Part Time Teachers

Mode of Evaluation: Feedback committee.

Feedback Received: 100%

General analysis: After careful consideration of the feedback received it was unanimously reviewed and resolved to take further course of action. The feedback on the 11 points criteria is analyzed as follow:

1. **Objectives of the syllabus:** 90% teachers have responded with excellent and rest 10% responded with Good remarks about the syllabus prescribed by Sambalpur University.
2. **Freedom of new techniques/strategies of assessment:** 100% teachers have responded with excellent remarks.
3. **Interesting subject for majority of students:** 100% teachers find the syllabus interesting for students learning with the newly introduced course content of revised Model Syllabus.
4. **Bridging the gap between Theory and Practical:** 90% teachers having practical subjects have given excellent remarks. However rest 10% find it difficult for practical subject due to non-availability of the equipment prescribed in the market with in the budget provision.
5. **Bridging the gap between academics and industry:** 40% teachers have responded with good remarks regarding the provision of employability in the syllabus. Rest 60% faculty in Arts Stream have stressed on the need of inclusion of Industry-related syllabus.
6. **Improvement of Employability Skill:** 60% teachers have opined on the improvement of employability skills through the syllabus. Rest 40% have stressed on the inclusion of more skill-based courses.
7. **Offering of the Electives in terms of their relevance to the specialization stream and technological advancement:** 100% teachers find excellent.
8. **Size of the syllabus in terms of load:** 100% teachers have given excellent remarks on the size of the syllabus. However, many have suggested for filling the vacant post to cover the course in time.
9. **Percentage of courses having laboratory components and the domain used for designing the experiments for the laboratory:** 90% teachers have made excellent remarks. Rest 20% very good.
10. **Evaluation scheme for each course:** 100% very good.
11. **Allocation of credit and conduct hours:** Very good, 100% remarks.

Action Taken Report:

- Recommended to procure the latest equipment in Science stream for the conduct of practical as prescribed in the revised syllabus.
- Recommended for arrangement of skill-based training for better employability from next academic session.
- Recommended to hold special session with the students department wise to transfer the theoretical knowledge into industry.
- Recommended to fill up the vacant post in Science stream through contractual appointment to reduce the load of covering the syllabus in time.

Analysis of Feedback of Students

On curriculum, Course and Teaching Learning Evaluation for the year 2022-23

Mode of Feedback: Collection of feedback in prescribed format through WhatsApp group and print copy.

Stake Holders: +3 Arts/science/Commerce (Honors) 6th, 4th and 2nd Semester.

Mode of Evaluation: Combined committee of different department.

Feedback Received: 20.6% of total enrollment.


General analysis: After careful consideration of the feedback received it was unanimously reviewed and resolved to take further course of action. The feedback on the 7 points criteria is analyzed as follow:

1. Content of the course and its relevance: 100% students have responded with excellent remarks (5) on the content of course prescribed by Sambalpur University and found it relevant to their study of interest.
2. Extent of syllabus covered in time: 100% students have positively responded with excellent remarks (5) regarding completion of courses in time. However, due to closer of physical classes on the ground of COVID-19 Pandemic situation some students could not avail the online teaching due to constraint caused by lack of access to internet and availability of android sets.
3. Effectiveness of the delivery of courses by the Faculty: 85% students are satisfied with very good remarks (4) regarding the delivery of courses in both online and offline mode. Rest 15% have given satisfactory remarks (2) due to intermittent disturbances caused by the absence of data and Wi-Fi connection problem.
4. Use of teaching Aids and ICT: 100% students have responded with excellent remarks (5) regarding use of teaching aids and ICT during the entire process of Admission, Examination and online conduct of classes through WhatsApp's , E-mail Groups, Google Meet, Zoom , YouTube etc.
5. Supply of additional source materials of and beyond the course: 90% students have responded with very good remarks (4) regarding Supply of additional source materials of and beyond the course during the entire period of online teaching in blended mode. Rest 10% difficulties are due to mobile data and internet access.
6. Opportunity for students beyond class room learning: 100% students have responded with very good remarks (4) regarding different opportunities offered to the students through a series of online webinar conducted on different topics like E-learning, Entrepreneurship, Health and Hygiene, Yoga and other issues relevant to the academic and ethical values.
7. Guidance and counselling in academic, Curricular and extra-curricular activities: 100% students have responded with excellent remarks (5) regarding Guidance and counselling in academic, Curricular and extra-curricular activities conducted in the college by forming different mentoring groups and informing the students about all the activities through E-mail and WhatsApp groups during the year.

Action Taken Report:

- Recommended to update the library digitally for 100% coverage of E-resources for the benefit of the students.
- Recommended for strengthening of Honours groups through Group discussion, departmental seminar, essay quiz etc.
- Recommended to make provision for Xerox facilities for students for access to the materials available online.
- Recommended for wide coverage of Wi-Fi through Optic fiber from the next academic session for successful implementation of blended learning.

4. Action taken report on feedback: 2022-2023

1. The clarity of course objectives requires further enhancement. Since the college is affiliated to Sambalpur University it is mandatory for the U.G. Course. However, based on the feedback received from student body, the college has suggested the concerned University to make necessary change and make the education to be more inclusive and employable in terms of Course content as to meet criteria for Industries and Employment Exchange Agency.
2. The adequacy of suggested references requires improvement. Gathering feedback from teachers is pivotal. The institution is trying to improve its lab equipment facilities for practical subjects. Furthermore, the IQAC has suggested the Principal to make a provision for budgetary allocation for the procurement of lab equipments to incorporate in their practical classes.
3. Enhancing the relevance of course content to real life application is crucial. As per the course content for Science and Commerce is concerned, it has depth for employability to some extent however; its inadequacy is seen in Arts streams where the University needs to review its curriculum when it comes to employment for Arts students.
4. So far the employment is concerned; IQAC conducts time to time various Orientation and Workshop for the students by inviting industrial experts where students would be motivated to align instructional material with practical examples, case studies, and industry-specific scenarios. Fields visit will be increased and a push for more internship will be emphasized. IQAC has decided to increase this to a maximum number in the upcoming Academic session.
